

HIGH POINT AWARDS DIVISIONS

All divisions are restricted to all-Morgan classes unless otherwise noted

There is a \$5.00 fee per horse or exhibitor for each division entered. Fees must accompany the nomination form and must be postmarked prior to any show or event to be counted.

1. Halter Stallions, Mares, and Geldings – all breed classes to count.
2. Morgan Amateur Western Pleasure – Amateur classes only – must state Amateur in the name of the class or in the description. A.O.T.R. classes to count. No junior exhibitor, youth, novice horse/rider, maiden, ladies, limit, Jack Benny or open classes to count.
3. Morgan Open Western Pleasure – Novice horse/rider, junior horse, maiden, limit, youth and ladies classes to count but no junior exhibitor, Jack Benny or amateur classes to count.
4. Morgan Amateur Hunter Pleasure – same rules as division #2.
5. Morgan Open Hunter Pleasure – same rules as division #3.
6. Morgan Classic Pleasure Riding – Classic classes only – must state Classic in the name of the class. No junior exhibitor classes to count.
7. Morgan Classic Pleasure Driving – same rules as division #6.
8. Morgan Amateur English Pleasure – same rules as division #2.
9. Morgan Open English Pleasure – same rules as division #3.
10. Morgan Amateur Pleasure Driving – same rules as division #2.
11. Morgan Open Pleasure Driving – same rules as division #3.
12. Morgan Amateur Park Saddle and Harness – same rules as division #2.
13. Morgan Open Park Saddle and Harness – same rules as division #3.
14. Road Hack/Bridle Path – Morgan and all breed classes, all seats to count. Must ride a registered Morgan.
15. Open Saddleseat Pleasure/Pleasure Driving – All saddleseat and pleasure driving classes that are open to all breeds to count. Exhibitor must ride/drive a registered Morgan. No junior exhibitor or amateur classes to count.
16. Open Hunter and Western Pleasure – All hunter and western pleasure classes that are open to all breeds to count. Exhibitor must ride a registered Morgan. No junior exhibitor or amateur classes to count.
17. Adult Exhibitor Riding/Driving – All breed classes, all seats/driving to count. Exhibitor gains the points as long as riding/driving a registered Morgan. Equitation and junior exhibitor classes do not qualify but youth, novice rider/horse, maiden, ladies, men's, amateur, limit, junior horse and Jack Benny classes to count.
18. Lead Line (6 years and under) – All seats, all breed classes to count. Exhibitor must ride a registered Morgan mare or gelding that is being led by a capable handler.
19. Walk Trot Equitation and Pleasure (11 years and under) – All seats, all breed classes to count. Exhibitor must ride a registered Morgan mare or gelding.
20. Junior Exhibitor (13 years and under) – Includes fitting and showmanship, driving and all classes designated for the junior exhibitor. All breed classes, all seats/driving to count. Exhibitor gains the points as long as riding/driving a registered Morgan mare or gelding.
21. Junior Exhibitor (14 to 17 years) – same rules as division #20.
22. Equitation (13 years and under) – All seats, all breed classes to count. Exhibitor must ride a registered Morgan mare or gelding. Name of class must indicate that it is an equitation class.
23. Equitation (14 to 17 years of age) – same rules as division #22.
24. Adult Equitation (18 years and over) – same rules as division #22.
25. Working Hunter/Hunter Hack – Includes all Morgan and open classes shown over a course of at least 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. Hunter hack classes in which horses are required to hand gallop one way of the ring and jump two fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. No junior exhibitor to count.
26. Carriage Driving – All breed carriage classes to count, but must drive a registered Morgan.
27. Roadster – Includes all breed roadster classes, harness or under saddle, registered Morgan must be shown.
28. Dressage – Includes all levels of dressage, open or Morgan, registered Morgan must be shown.
